You would tell me how she was such a wonderful woman and that my dad really messed up. You would talk care of my dad when he got sick. You would always be at the hospital no matter what. A mother never stops worrying about her children. As I got older, i remember all the long conversations we would have on the phone. I remember sitting at your table talking about everything but nothing. The memory i cherish the most is when we sat at you kitchen table and talked about the loss of our sons. After my son died, you sat me down and talked about all the things you went through. We talked about how a mother never stops mourning the loss of thier children. You opened up about some very difficult emotions and gave me some very wonderful advice. That sharp jagged knife stabbing in my heart wasnt so sharp any more. You always would tell me that you loved me and would be praying for my son. Not even death can take that beautiful memory away. Grandma you are the woman I always

wanted to be. You are strong, independent, but loving. You love your family unconditionally. I'm very lucky to have women like you in my life. Woman who are a beacon of light to all those in her family. We are all following in your footsteps trying to be the loving mother, grandmother, sister, and wife you were.
